## **1. Introduction to C-BRTA**

- 1.1. The Cross-Border Road Transport Agency (C-BRTA) is PFMA Schedule 3A Agency established through the Cross-Border Road Transport Act 4 of 1998 and provides advice, regulation, facilitation and law enforcement in respect of commercial cross border road transportation. The Act gives the C-BRTA mandate to licence commercial cross border road transport operators by issuing permits to operate. The provision of cross-border transport services in South Africa is subject to the provisions of the Cross-Border Road Transport Act. In terms of the Act, any person or organisation wishing to provide cross-border transport services must apply to the Cross-Border Road Transport Agency's Regulatory Committee for a Permit to conduct cross-border business.
- 1.2. The Cross-Border Road Transport Agency's (C-BRTA) thus exists, amongst others, to improve the flow of passengers and freight road transport in the region, introduce regulated competition in cross-border road transport, reduce operational constraints for the cross-border road transport industry, provide oversight and monitoring functions, and to improve the unimpeded transport flow by road of freight and passengers.

## **2. General rules and instructions**

- 2.1. Bidders or their agents shall not make any news releases concerning this RFQ or the awarding of the same or any resulting agreement(s) without the consent of, and then only in co-ordination with, C-BRTA and its Client.
- 2.2. Bidders must be registered on the Central Supplier Database (CSD) to be able to conduct business with C-BRTA.
- 2.3. Any bidder who has reasons to believe that the RFQ specification is based on a specific brand must inform C-BRTA within three (3) days after the publication of the RFQ.
- 2.4. Bidders will be given seven (7) days to correct their non-tax compliance and three (3) days to fully disclose any information on the Standard Bidding Documents, failure such bidders will be disqualified.
- 2.5. This RFQ is subject to Government Procurement: General Contract Conditions – July 2011, Special Contract Conditions and any other contract conditions to be finalised during contracting.

## **3. Instructions for submitting bids**

- 3.1. Bidders should submit their bid responses strictly to the email address on the covering page. Bid responses received outside this email address will NOT be considered.
- 3.2. Bid responses will NOT be considered if submitted after the closing date and time.

## 5. INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

- The Cross-Border Road Transport Agency (C-BRTA) is a Schedule 3A regulatory authority established under the Cross-Border Road Transport Act, No. 4 of 1998. The C-BRTA's primary mandate is to regulate and facilitate cross-border road transport between South Africa and its neighboring countries within the SADC region. The agency ensures seamless movement of goods and passengers across borders by promoting an efficient, sustainable and regulated road transport industry.
- The C-BRTA has a law enforcement division whose function ensures that there is compliance with the Cross-Border Road Transport act, permit requirements, road transport and traffic legislation and maintaining records of operators. This function amongst others is mandated with the responsibility of ensuring that the transporters of commuters and freight are in possession of valid cross border permits and monitors drivers' compliance.

## 6. SCOPE OF WORK

The C-BRTA requires the services of an appropriately experienced and professional service provider for the branding of Law Enforcement vehicles.

The following vehicle types will require new branding:-

## 7. SPECIFICATION

### 7.1. Technical Requirements

The technical requirements include:

Use of high-quality, durable, and compliant reflective and fluorescent materials with embedded watermarks and approval marks for traceability and anti-counterfeiting.

Materials must meet or exceed standards such as SANS 1519-1 and SANS 20104 (ECE R104), with valid test reports submitted with the bid.

Application of markings must follow detailed design layouts, including specific colours, sizes, and positioning as per specifications.

Markings must be cut with specified radii (e.g., 2-5 mm) and sealed on edges to prevent dirt and water ingress.

Application of markings on various vehicle parts (front, sides, rear) with precise dimensions, placement, and design, including special features like badge, hotline number, slogans, and stripe sequences.

Application must be performed in a controlled environment, with sufficient skilled personnel, and within specified timeframes to ensure consistency and quality.

Provision of warranties for reflective materials (minimum 5-7 years durability), guarantees from manufacturers, and compliance with occupational health and safety standards.

Compliance with all relevant legislation and standards including the ability to demark markings without damage to vehicles.

The design layout contain four (04) primary Pantone colours; Blue, Yellow, Grey and Burgundy.

## **7.2. Design**

Mock up designs for a sedan and Light Delivery Vehicles are attached to give an indication on the extent of work on each vehicle types.

Although most areas of design are standard, the width and length of design on the sides of the vehicles may vary depending on the die lines.

The bidder is required to supply the vehicle die lines and prepare mock up designs, in open format style, for each category of vehicle.

The appointed bidder is not to commence any work until a mock-up design is approved by the end user.

## **8. EXPECTED OUTCOMES / DELIVERABLES**

Supply and delivery of branded vehicles must be according to the approved mock-up design, specified material and agreed timelines.

## **9. VIEWING OF BRANDED FLEET**

Bidders are invited to view some of the current fleet of branded vehicles at the C-BRTA by prior appointment.

## 10. SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS TO SERVICE PROVIDER

The appointed bidder is required to supply the vehicle die lines and prepare mockup designs, in open format style, for each type of vehicle to be branded.

## 11. WARRANTY

Defects identified during the warranty period must be corrected by the appointed bidder to the acceptance of the end user.

1.7 Failure on the part of a tenderer to submit proof or documentation required in terms of this tender to claim points for specific goals with the tender, will be interpreted to mean that preference points for specific goals are not claimed.

1.8 The organ of state reserves the right to require of a tenderer, either before a tender is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to
