1. Introduction to C-BRTA

- 1.1. The Cross-Border Road Transport Agency (C-BRTA) is PFMA Schedule 3A Agency established through the Cross-Border Road Transport Act 4 of 1998 and provides advice, regulation, facilitation and law enforcement in respect of commercial cross border road transportation. The Act gives the C-BRTA mandate to licence commercial cross border road transport operators by issuing permits to operate. The provision of cross-border transport services in South Africa is subject to the provisions of the Cross-Border Road Transport Act. In terms of the Act, any person or organisation wishing to provide cross-border transport services must apply to the Cross-Border Road Transport Agency's Regulatory Committee for a Permit to conduct cross-border business.
- 1.2. The Cross-Border Road Transport Agency's (C-BRTA) thus exists, amongst others, to improve the flow of passengers and freight road transport in the region, introduce regulated competition in cross-border road transport, reduce operational constraints for the cross-border road transport industry, provide oversight and monitoring functions, and to improve the unimpeded transport flow by road of freight and passengers.

2. General rules and instructions

- 2.1. Bidders or their agents shall not make any news releases concerning this RFQ or the awarding of the same or any resulting agreement(s) without the consent of, and then only in co-ordination with, C-BRTA and its Client.
- 2.2. Bidders must be registered on the Central Supplier Database (CSD) to be able to conduct business with C-BRTA.
- 2.3. Any bidder who has reasons to believe that the RFQ specification is based on a specific brand must inform C-BRTA within three (3) days after the publication of the RFQ.

5. TERMS OF REFERENCE

5.1. **PROJECT TITLE**

Procurement of a Vehicle Intelligence Data System (VIDS) for Strategic Transport Data Analysis.

5.2 **PURPOSE**

The purpose of the VIDS is to provide CBRTA with a modern, scalable, and user-friendly platform that:

- Enables in-depth analysis of vehicle and operator data.
- Consolidates data from multiple internal and external sources into a single repository.
- Generates real-time and periodic reports, dashboards, and visualizations.
- Supports early detection of risk trends, fraud, and regulatory non-compliance.
- Lays the foundation for evidence-based enforcement and strategic planning.

The VIDS is not intended as a live tracking or biometric identification system, but rather a data analytics and intelligence solution, focused on interpreting historical and current transport data.

Procurement of a Vehicle Intelligence Data System (VIDS) for Strategic Transport Data Analysis.

INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

- 5.2.1. The Cross-Border Road Transport Agency (CBRTA) is a statutory authority mandated to regulate cross-border road transport, enhance regional trade facilitation, and improve the effectiveness of freight and passenger movement across South African borders.
- 5.2.2. To support evidence-based regulation and strategic planning, CBRTA is procuring the Vehicle Intelligence Data System (VIDS), a modern, scalable, and user-centric platform designed specifically for the transport sector. Its primary function is to consolidate vehicle and operator data from various internal and external systems into a unified repository. Through advanced analytics, reporting, and visualization tools, VIDS enables the Cross Border Road Transport Agency (CBRTA) to gain deep insights into compliance trends, operator behaviour, and cross-border movement.
- 5.2.3. The system supports real-time data querying, risk detection, and regulatory enforcement planning without relying on live tracking or biometric features. With secure integration capabilities, role-based access, and adherence to CBRTA's data governance

- standards, VIDS lays a robust foundation for evidence-based decision-making and strategic operational planning.
- 5.2.4. The Act determines that the Road Transport Inspectorate must, from time to time, submit a report to the Regulatory Committee containing the following:
 - a. law enforcement information on a route basis.
 - b. general information on traffic flows and tendencies; or
 - c. any other matters as may be prescribed by the Committee.
- 5.2.5. Section 25 of the Act prohibits any person from undertaking cross-border road transport without a valid permit. The C-BRTA is further mandated to enforce the provisions of the Act, through law enforcement to ensure that permit holders operate within the within the prescribed legal parameters/permit conditions.
- 5.2.6. The Agency, amongst other things collects intelligence from various sources (internal / external) about operators, traffic flows and tendencies, including behavioural patterns; and then present detailed reports to the Regulatory Committee of the Agency.

6. OBJECTIVE

The objective of the request is to invite suitable qualified and a reputable professional service provider to quote for the Procurement of a Vehicle Intelligence Data System (VIDS) for Strategic Transport Data Analysis.

7. SCOPE OF WORK

- 7.1. Bidders must quote on Supply and license a transport-sector-specific Vehicle Intelligence Data System (VIDS) software solution to the Cross Border Road Transport Agency (CBRTA).
- 7.2. The software must support transport-specific data types and queries including vehicle registrations, permits, contraventions, operator histories, and cross-border activity.
- 7.3. The system must be licensed for use by CBRTA and support concurrent multi-user access with role-based permissions.
- 7.4. Deployment must be flexible for either on-premises or cloud-based infrastructure as determined by CBRTA.
- 7.5. The system must conform to CBRTA's data governance, security, and access control policies.
- 7.6. Configuration of the software to align with CBRTA's data architecture, user roles, reporting hierarchy, and operational structure.
- 7.7. Integrate the VIDS software with the following CBRTA data systems:
 - Cross Easy permit system
 - Automatic number plate Recognition System

- Operator Compliance Accreditation System
- Enforcer (Inspection and Contravention records)
- Other relevant information datasets. (Spreadsheets)
- 7.8. Support for secure APIs or direct database linkages.
- 7.9. Maintain data consistency and integrity across systems through validation and synchronization tools.
- 7.10. Migrate legacy database including permits records, vehicle histories, and operator profiles.
- 7.11. Apply data cleansing and normalization processes to ensure accuracy and compatibility.
- 7.12. Perform validation routines to detect and correct data anomalies.
- 7.13. VIDS must support real-time queries against integrated databases including:
 - Cross Easy Permit systems
 - Automatic number plate Recognition System (ANPR)
 - National Traffic Contravention Management System (NTCMS)
 - Natis
 - Enforcer
 - Othe national hotlists and databases
- 7.14. System must allow dynamic query construction based on plate number, ID number, or Vehicle Identification Number (VIN)
- 7.15. System must automatically generate notifications upon detection of matches in queried databases.
- 7.16. Notification delivery must support multiple channels, including on-screen alerts and third-party integrations.
- 7.17. Alerts must be customizable based on user roles, severity levels, and response protocols.
- 7.18. All data entries and queries must be associated with location coordinates and timestamps.
- 7.19. The system must store this metadata and include it in reports and alerts for operational tracking.
- 7.20. Provide authorized users with the ability to perform manual queries from any location via a secure interface.
- 7.21. Enable users to search the centralized database using multiple identifiers (e.g., number plate, VIN, ID number).
- 7.22. Include user activity logging and audit trail functionality for compliance and monitoring purposes.
- 7.23. Specifications of the Vehicle Intelligence Data System (VIDS) is as follows:

VIDS is purpose-built for the transport sector, supporting advanced analysis of vehicle and operator data, with a focus on cross-border operations, compliance, and enforcement trends. Aggregates and unifies data from CBRTA's internal systems and external national databases into a centralized repository, ensuring seamless access and holistic insights

Software Capabilities

Sector-Specific Design: Purpose-built for the transport sector, supporting specialized data types including vehicle registrations, permits, contraventions, operator histories, and cross-border movement logs.

Data Querying & Analytics

Real-time and historical data queries.

Dynamic guery filters based on vehicle plate number, ID number, and VIN.

Visual and tabular reporting tools to support compliance, inspection, and planning efforts.

Licensing & Access Control

Enterprise Licensing: Licensed for full use by CBRTA, supporting unlimited queries and analytics within defined user tiers.

8. EXPECTED OUTCOMES

- 8.1. The offer must be inclusive of software, analytics tools, and storage infrastructure required to implement the Vehicle Intelligence Data System (VIDS). The solution must be deployed within a designated CBRTA-managed environment (either onpremises or cloud-based) and be fully compatible and interoperable with current CBRTA technologies, including Cross Easy, OCAS, Enforcer, and internal spreadsheets.
- 8.2. The successful bidder must propose a clear methodology and phased project implementation plan aligned with the scope of work, covering requirements

- gathering, data migration, integration, system configuration, user training, testing, and final deployment. The plan must also include post-implementation support and knowledge transfer to CBRTA staff.
- 8.3. Prior to execution of work, the service provider shall enter into a formal Service Level Agreement (SLA) with the CBRTA, outlining performance metrics, support response times, data protection standards, and system uptime guarantees.
- 8.4. All software licenses, developed configurations, and associated system documentation delivered as part of the VIDS implementation shall become the property of the CBRTA at the end of the contractual period, ensuring full ownership, continuity, and independence for the agency in future system upgrades or vendor transitions.

9. DURATION

9.1. It is expected that the service be provided for a period of thirty-six (36) months.

10. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

10.1. The CBRTA will take ownership of any reports, any work and other intellectual property that will arise out of this project.

11. PROJECT MANAGEMENT

11.1. A Joint Monitoring Management task team, consisting of CBRTA Deputy Commissioners: Law Enforcement and Provider Will be established. This committee will meet on a monthly basis.
